After the course students will be able to comprehend the geopolitical position of Finland against the historical background, as well as the relationship between Finland and its neighbouring countries. Students will have developed their critical thinking and as well as their contextualization and argumentation skills.

**Sisältö:**

The course introduces students to Finnish history from the Middle Ages up to the present day. The focus is on the main outlines of Finnish history, which reaches back far beyond the birth of the independent sovereign state of Finland. While Finland is like other Nordic countries in many ways, it has a distinctive history of being a part of and a neighbour to powerful states surrounding the Baltic Sea. Additionally, the climate and remoteness of Finland have shaped it in many ways. Understanding the historical development of Finland is crucial to

understanding contemporary Finland and its people. In addition to political history, Finnish social, cultural and economic history is also discussed during the lectures. In the home essay and short presentation, students will be able to research a subject they are interested in.

The students will have familiarized with key concepts and notions within the disciplines of Linguistic Anthropology and Sociolinguistics. This will allow the students to better navigate multilingual contexts, whilst appreciating the multiple entanglements intrinsic to language diversity.

**Sisältö:**

In this course, the students will be introduced to key notions within Linguistic Anthropology and Sociolinguistics, such as language power and inequality, language ideologies and attitudes, multilingualism, minority and Indigenous languages and human-environment relations through a communicative lens. The course will enable the students to familiarize with different metaphors of language. During the course, we will thus approach language and communicative practices through structural, semiotic, and phenomenological analyses. No linguistic background is required. The course is suited for all those students who are interested in the interconnections between language and the broader ecology, including policy, economic factors, and the environment.

Working methods include lectures followed by tutorials. The students will be asked to take active participation in the tutorials, by discussing the readings, presented topics, and compiling exploratory learning diaries.

Spring semester

**Osaamistavoitteet:**

Upon completion of the course the students will be familiarized with the socio-economic and ecological aspects of the Baltic Sea environment of today. They will be able to:

- discuss about the current state of the Baltic Sea in terms of nature and economic activities.
- define the major environmental threats for the Baltic Sea and follow the public discussions on that matter in the media (newspapers etc.) and
- work in group and build their own reflections on group activities.

**Sisältö:**

The course explores the physical particularities of the marine environment and the short and long-term changes that the sea undergoes. It also addresses the development of human activities and the interactions with the natural environment, i.e. the past and current adaptation of human activities to environmental changes and the impacts of human pressures on marine ecosystems. Students will get familiar with topics such as eutrophication, sea ice, climate change, navigation, Hanse, tourism, EU strategy for the Baltic Sea Region among others.
