Please read carefully the information of each course you wish to take (language of instruction, target group, contents, timing, prerequisites, assessment methods, additional information etc.).

All exchange students must submit their exchange application through [SoleMOVE](#).

Actual course registration takes place once you have arrived in Oulu and received your University of Oulu login information. More information on registration will be provided during orientation in the beginning of the semester. When registering to courses, please take a look at the detailed information on teaching and schedule under the **Instruction** tab.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

- Students coming from the bilateral partner institutions (outside of Europe) and from the Erasmus+ partner institutions/departments of the Faculty of Humanities have priority for enrolment to the [Scandinavian Studies Programme](#) . Students from other Faculties should contact the programme coordinator to get more information about enrollment.
- The courses organized by the department of **English Philology** are available **only** for the students coming from the partner institutions of the subject **and** who have English Philology as major subject in their home university.
- Most subjects in the Faculty of Humanities have a wide range of courses which are not taught in English but can be completed by taking **a book exam** instead. In this case students will study the course materials (books or articles) independently and will then register to a written examination based on the course materials. **The details of a book exam should always be agreed upon with the course teacher.**
- The Faculty of Humanities also offers courses in French and German for exchange students with a language proficiency level of B2 or higher.
