General Theology

General Theology is a subject available at the Faculty of Humanities. The curriculum of the **Faculty of Theology of the University of Helsinki** is used in the teaching of General Theology at the Faculty of Humanities.

Admission requirements

Students should apply for the study right at the Open University. A fee must be paid for the studies.

Overview of the subject

General Theology is not an independent theological subject, but a collage of different theological subjects. It includes the basics of exegetics, church history, systematic theology, practical theology and comparative religion. The curriculum of the **Faculty of Theology of the University of Helsinki** is used in the teaching of General Theology at the Faculty of Humanities. The Basic and Intermediate Studies of General Theology (60 credits) grant students who already have the qualifications of a subject teacher the eligibility to teach religion in elementary school and, as a secondary teaching subject, in upper secondary school.

Study Packages

Basic Studies 25 credits

Learning objectives

After completing the Basic Studies (25 credits), students will be familiar with the problems of the origin and the essential content of the Bible, the history of the Christian church and the basic questions of Christian faith and ethics. In addition, the students will study other religions, especially the high religions and the contemporary new religions. Furthermore, students will become acquainted with the functions of a Christian congregation and church service, as well as with the educational work of the church and religious education at school.

Content

The Basic Studies package of General Theology (25 credits) comprises the courses 708100P-708104P. The student will complete a 5-credit course in each of the five subjects, including lectures and independent reading.

Grading

Each course is graded using the scale 0-5. The overall grade for the study packages is determined by the weighted average of the course grades. The packages are graded using the following scale: Excellent (5), Very good (4), Good (3), Satisfactory (2) or Sufficient (1).

Learning objectives

After completing the Intermediate Studies (35 credits), students will have an understanding of the traditional theological subjects. With the Basic and Intermediate Studies (60 credits) students who already have the qualifications of a subject teacher receive the eligibility to teach religion in elementary school and, as a secondary teaching subject, in secondary school. To be admitted to pursue the Intermediate Studies in General Theology, students must have completed the Basic Studies with the overall grade 'Good' (the weighted average of courses at least 3/5).

Content

The Intermediate studies in General Theology comprise five courses with the scope of 5 credits (708105A - 708110A). In addition to these, the students will participate in the seminar of General Theology and write a seminar paper in the area of one of the theological subjects. The scope of the seminar (708110A is ten (10) credits in total.

Grading

Each course is graded using the scale 0-5. The overall grade for the study packages is determined by calculating the weighted average of the course grades. The packages are graded using the following scale: Excellent (5), Very good (4), Good (3), Satisfactory (2) or Sufficient (1).
