Philosophy can be studied by any student presently registered and enrolled at the University.

Philosophy

Philosophy is considered to be one of the first sciences. Scientific thought first emerged as philosophy and thus philosophy is sometimes referred to as "the mother of science". Today philosophy examines the methodological problems common to sciences derived from it as well as metaphysical questions irreducible to these sciences. Philosophy examines also the nature and limitations of human knowledge, language, argumentation and logic, as well as questions of value and morality that form the basis of ethics and politics. Central fields of study in philosophy are metaphysics and ontology, epistemology and the philosophy of science, the philosophy of nature and the environment, the philosophy of values, ethics and social philosophy. The history of philosophy provides an overall view of the development of these fields – many philosophical problems are timeless and thus the history of philosophy has great significance in the context of systematic philosophical thinking as well. Philosophy also extensively studies metaphysical and epistemological questions concerning the principles of science. While this makes Philosophy a useful subsidiary (minor) subject for prospective researchers, the philosophical study of values, ethics, and politics promotes social discourse and provides aspects for social decision-making.

In Oulu, the focus fields of philosophical research are environmental philosophy, the history of philosophy, as well as the philosophy of history and historiography. AgeAds received the highest grade, "outstanding", in the latest RAE evaluation.

Philosophical methods have proven especially beneficial in the academic education of researchers. Studying philosophy is recommendable at any level of study because philosophical thinking contributes to the academic writing process. Philosophy can be studied as subsidiary subject by students in all faculties. Additionally, Philosophy has recently become a compulsory subject in Finnish upper secondary schools, and demand for qualified teachers has increased significantly. It is a suitable subsidiary subject for students from various fields who aim to become teachers.

Employment prospects

Studies in Philosophy foster the skills required in many professions, especially administrative positions, in which a careful assessment of the values and goals of actions, as well as their links to society and the environment are required. Philosophy often helps envision things in the big picture and thus philosophical skills are useful in all professions that require skills in critical thinking: executive and administrative positions, in the professions of researchers, teachers and journalists, in consultant positions of various fields, etc. The value of philosophy is, however, difficult to measure in economic terms; it contributes significantly to the growth of social and cultural capital.

Practical information

Students can complete two study packages in Philosophy:

- Basic Studies (25 ECTS credits)
- Intermediate Studies (35 ECTS credits)

Nearly all courses in Philosophy can be completed as book examinations or by assessment methods that are connected with contact teaching. Exceptions to this rule are seminars, which are completed as seminar workshops and written assignments. Students must sign up for book examinations ten days before the exam via WebOodi. Book exams are graded by the person responsible for the course (University Lecturer or University Researcher). Book exams can be taken on the general examination days of the Faculty of Humanities or on the examination days of the degree group (Group I – History). Other methods of assessment (essays, summaries, small-scale studies, oral examination) must be separately agreed upon with the person responsible.

Advanced studies of Philosophy can be completed at other universities. Students must apply for a study right in the chosen university. More information about the different options is provided by the Lecturer of Philosophy.

Study packages and learning outcomes

Basic Studies 25 ECTS credits

After completing the Basic Studies package, students will have gained an understanding of the special nature of philosophical questions, their historical permanence and their significance in critical analysis of various disciplines, society and culture. Students will also be able to perceive both the theoretical and practical significance of philosophy and will be able to ask philosophical questions concerning ethically conscious every-day life as well as the principles of their fields of study. Students will be able to display an understanding of the most central concepts and fundamental fields of theoretical and practical philosophy. Students will also be familiar with the most important classical thinkers as well as historical stages of development in philosophy, and will be able to interpret elementary classical texts. Students will also possess the basic skills needed for constructive philosophical dialogue in seminars.

Intermediate Studies 35 ECTS credits

The Intermediate Studies package provides students with a more comprehensive view of the theories behind the contemporary trends in philosophy, and after completion students will be knowledgeable about contemporary developments in Finnish philosophy. In the Intermediate Studies, students will deepen their knowledge of the philosophy of science and learn about the historical nature of science and knowledge. They will familiarise themselves with the basics of the philosophy of value, as well as with the application of ethical theories in the context of global problems. The Intermediate Studies package provides students with the skills to recognise their personal fields of interest in philosophy by introducing them to literature from a special field. Students will develop these personal interests into research by working in seminar groups. Students will also be able to deepen their view of the

classics of philosophy in seminars. Students will furthermore develop their skills for creating philosophical dialogue via discussions in seminars and possibly by working in study circles and by other communicative working methods.
