Estonian Language and Culture

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Language and culture of Estonia as a minor subject

The culture, history, and present-day situation of Finland's southern neighbour, Estonia, are both surprisingly similar and interestingly different when compared with Finland. As a related language, Estonian presents a challenge to students wishing to become better acquainted with the history and modern-day situation of the Finnish language. Travel, economic, political, cultural, and personal contacts between the two countries are close and diverse. Estonia is a rapidly developing country, and experts in its language and culture are in demand in Finland, Estonia, and the European Union.

The University of Oulu offers Basic Studies (25 credits) and Intermediate Studies (35 credits) in Estonian language and culture studies. The Estonian language basic course (4 credits) is a prerequisite. The emphasis is on a contrastive study of the Finnish and Estonian languages and cultures and Finnish and Estonian as a second or foreign language. The languages of instruction during Basic Studies are both Finnish and Estonian; in Intermediate Studies the language of instruction is Estonian. The goal is to educate professionals knowledgeable about the Estonian language and culture for the working-life needs of Northern Finland in particular. Language and culture of Estonia is available to all students of the University of Oulu. The courses of this minor subject can substitute as optional courses in some Intermediate and Advanced study modules for Finnish language students. The Estonian language basic course is an obligatory course for students majoring in Finnish. The basic course is held every autumn term. Part of the studies in this subject can be completed by being an exchange student at the Estonian universities in Tartu or Tallinn. Students should contact lecturer Heli Laanekask when seeking to substitute courses from these universities for equivalent courses here.
