Finnish Language

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Finnish as a major subject

Finnish Language Studies, also known as Fennistics (Finnish linguistics), is a branch of the humanities that features different aspects of language as its core educational and study areas: use, structure, development and variation. At the University of Oulu, cognitive and contextual semantics, contrastive research, sociolinguistics, conversation analysis, and Finnish as a second or foreign language are emphasized. When choosing research material, the northern aspect is emphasized.

The aim of the subject is to educate versatile professionals in various aspects of language especially for the needs of Northern Finland. This aim is reached by utilizing purpose-oriented teaching and research. The subject is known for its role in the development of the educational field, and it has specialized in web-based teaching.

The completion of the BA and MA degrees requires about five years of studying altogether. The subject by itself does not prepare for a specific profession: in addition to Finnish Language, students need to select suitable minor subjects based on their future professional goals. The degree requires additional compulsory studies in languages and communication.

Some of the students who have Finnish as their major subject become teachers of Finnish and literature. These students often choose as their minors (Finnish) Literature, Speech Communication, and pedagogical studies (teacher's pedagogical studies). Some of the majors become teachers of Finnish language and communication for vocational schools. These students, as well as students aiming to be PR officers, reporters or language consultants, should also complete studies in the field of communication offered by the department. Students aiming to teach Finnish Language to those whose mother tongue is not Finnish should consider the courses in Finnish as a Second or Foreign Language.

Engaging in research while studying and participating in possible projects increases a student's chances of landing a job of his/her liking. The major subject also includes the opportunity becoming familiar with working life through various traineeships. Studies in the subject can be taken until the doctorate thesis. It is becoming more common for numerous MAs to continue their studies also some years after graduation or beginning to work.

Finnish as a minor subject

Finnish is a compulsory minor subject for students of Literature planning to become teachers of Finnish and literature. Finnish is also a good minor subject for students of other languages, History, and Information Studies, in addition to those who become class teachers.

Students of Literature can freely choose Finnish language as their minor subject: others need to take an entrance examination.

A student minoring in Finnish has to take the following three courses: Structure of Finnish (3 credits), Introduction to General Linguistics (4 credits), and Introduction to Phonetics (3 credits). These three courses are included in the Intermediate Optional courses for minor subject students, but are to be taken during Basic Studies. If the student's major subject already requires these three courses (mainly other language subjects), he/she will take other optional courses amounting to 10 credits.

Admission requirements and commencement of studies

A would-be major student can gain admission by passing the entrance examination that is held during the summer. Students enrolled at the University of Oulu can be admitted with Finnish as their major after completing Basic and Intermediate Studies in Finnish with good grades and applying to change their major subject.

In order to be admitted as a minor student, one must participate in the annual entrance examination held in May or June. The supervisor of studies gives out further information regarding the examination. Students of Literature at the University of Oulu can freely choose the subject as a minor without having to take the entrance examination.

Tutoring

At the beginning of the autumn term, a meeting will be held where new students receive information about studying and the department, and have a chance to meet the staff. Students are divided into tutoring groups, and each student will draw up a personal study plan (HOPS). Tutoring groups meet during the academic year under the guidance of a tutor, giving students a chance to discuss various matters concerning their studies. For students with Finnish as a minor subject, there will be a separate meeting at the beginning of the autumn term.

Employment prospects

Most students become teachers of Finnish and literature for schools and colleges, or teachers of Finnish and communication for vocational schools. The number of people teaching Finnish as a second or foreign language to immigrants in Finland or as a foreign language in universities in other countries is continually increasing. Finnish language experts are in demand in the media field as reporters or PR officers. Some find work as researchers in universities or, for example, in the Research Institute for the Languages of Finland. MA graduates are able to find employment easily, and licentiates or doctors are also in demand.

Practical information

Choosing minor subjects

Students aiming to be subject teachers will take the Basic and Intermediate Studies in Literature (60 credits), Communication Studies (at least 15 credits), and pedagogical studies for the subject teacher (60 credits) as compulsory minor subjects. Students not pursuing a teaching career can choose their minors freely, and their degrees can vary a lot depending on the minor subjects chosen. Recommended minors include languages related to Finnish (Estonian and Saami), Finnish as a Second or Foreign Language, other languages, Literature, Communication Studies, and Social Science Studies. General Linguistics and Phonetics are recommended for people interested in careers as researchers. Quite often surprising and unconventional subject combinations prove to be useful, such as studies in marketing etc. Work experience and the ability to take the initiative are important when entering the work force.

Study sequence

Students can begin the Intermediate Studies after the Basic Studies have been completed with good grades (at least 3). Basic and Intermediate Studies are graded according to the average grades of courses. One factor in evaluating the Intermediate Studies grade is the grade of Basic Studies. Basic and Intermediate Studies are compiled and graded by Professor Harri Mantila.

Students can begin the Advanced Studies after their Candidate's thesis has been completed and both Basic and Intermediate Studies have been completed with good grades. The final grade of the Advanced Studies is calculated as an average of courses. One factor taken into account is the Intermediate Studies grade, which must be a minimum of 3. Advanced Studies are compiled and graded by Professor Helena Sulkala.

In as much as it is possible, optional studies that are part of the Advanced Studies will be arranged annually.

When writing literature summaries, 400-500 pages in Finnish and 250-300 pages in some other language equal three credits.

Web-based learning

Most of the content in Basic and Intermediate Studies is available for independent study as web-based courses. These courses are located in the web-based Optima workspace (http://optima.oulu.fi). When studying in the Optima environment, the student will plan his/her schedule following the normal course timetable and studies on his/her own, while interacting with the teacher and other networked students of the course. Web-based courses are available during the same time as the regular courses. Most of the courses include examinations or other work that requires class attendance.

Curriculum

The curriculum (autumn and spring bulletin) comes out in the beginning of each term. It is found on the department website. The periods mentioned in the course descriptions are chronologically placed: periods 1 and 2 are for studies in the autumn term, and periods 3 and 4 include studies to be taken in the spring term.

Examinations and signing up for them

Most courses require passing an examination successfully. Courses including lectures do not require signing up for their examinations. For book exams you must sign up in WebOod at least 10 days before the exam is to take place. Late signups are not accepted. The Faculty's examination schedule is available at the Faculty website. The rules of the University of Oulu state that the results of the examinations are to be announced within three weeks from the date the teacher has received them for grading (paragraph §21: announcing the examination results, feedback, and correction). The results can be viewed in the Weboodi database and they are also in the binder for examination results in the student room. Assessment methods vary: in addition to examinations, essays and lecture diaries are also used.

Enrollment and office services

The student is to register annually either at the International Relations Office (most exchange and foreign students), or Student Affairs Office, and in the beginning of the first term at the office of Finnish Language (HU124). Both offices must be notified of changes in name or address.

Learning Objectives

After completing the Basic Studies, students will be familiar with the trends in Fennistics, the structures of Finnish and the main principles of language variation. In addition, they will have the ability to analyse texts critically. They will also be accustomed to using computers and computer networks as a learning environment.

After completing the Intermediate Studies, students will master the ethical and methodological principles for doing research and will be able to apply their knowledge in research of their own. They will be capable of receiving and giving criticism. They will have refined skills and knowledge in the areas of language structure, language variation and text linguistics. In addition, students will have become familiar with working life and acquainted themselves with special areas in linguistic knowledge.

After completing the Advanced Studies, students will be able to use and assess their knowledge of the Finnish language and apply it to analysing relatively challenging research material. They will have the skills to participate in the scientific discussion of their field. They will also be able to draw conclusions from earlier research. The students will master the historical background of Finnish and various research areas within Fennistics. Furthermore, they will be capable of writing, analysing and evaluating various literary texts.
