Music Education

The major subject in this programme is music education. As a music education student you develop your skills in different areas of music, familiarize yourself with different issues related to musicianship and education, enhance your own practical, theoretical and professional competence and develop your skills as a researcher. The studies are divided into basic, intermediate and advanced studies as well as the minor subjects, which include basic and intermediate studies in music and pedagogical studies for teachers. The pedagogical studies form part of both the Bachelor and Master degrees.

Music Education Studies

BA graduate is able to

- 1. collect relevant knowledge on different musical genres.
- 2. describe the range of educational contexts in music.
- 3. explicate his/her understanding of the music education content knowledge.

4. examine the appearance of the musicianship and the musical identity individually.

5. exhibit ability to combine the subject knowledge of world music, western art music and other musical cultures, embodiment (movement and music), music technology, free accompaniment, solfége and choir- and conducting to their practical contexts.

- 6. adapt the essence of being a musician as a music educator.
- 7. use various techniques in making music individually and in groups.
- 8. take responsibility of the content studies individually.
- 9. judge the relevance of the musicianship and "educatorship" individually.
- 10. show his/her expertise in various musical skills in his/her musicianship.

MA graduate is able to

- 2. discuss critically on various phenomenon in music education.
- 3. exhibit an individual, professional profile in music
- 4. adapt a deep understanding of an artistic identity individually.

- 7. collaborate equally with various art professionals
- 8. analyze research data in various research settings
- 9. judge the applicability of subject knowledge within the framework of the teaching context.
- 10. recognise challenges in teaching music in different educational context with various kind of pupils in various ages.
- 11. show empathy and judge his/her own actions situationally.
- 12. explicate research in music education up to doctoral studies

Music education is the major subject. The programme focuses on music teacher education for secondary and high school level. The minor studies including the BA studies are Music studies (basic and intermediate studies) and first part of the Pedagogical studies. Pedagogical studies are divided both in BA and MA studies.

Music education studies enable students to develop their skills in various sub-areas of music and competencies concerning musicianship and education with a professional knowledge of music education with a specific scientific perspective.

According to the requirements of the law, the student must be able to use Swedish both orally and in writing in various professional situations. Achieving this kind of proficiency during a course unit that lasts for only one semester requires that the student has already achieved the necessary starting proficiency level prior to taking the course. **Required proficiency level:**

The required <u>starting proficiency level</u> for students of all faculties is a grade of 7 or higher from the Swedish studies at secondary school (B-syllabus) or equivalent knowledge AND a passing grade from the proficiency test held at the beginning of the course unit. Based on this proficiency test the students are directed to brush up on their language skills with a self-study course (901028Y På väg 1-3, 2 ECTS credits) if it is deemed necessary; mastering basic vocabulary and grammar is a prerequisite to achieving the necessary language proficiency for the various communication situations one faces in professional life.

-If a student has not completed Swedish studies (B-language) at secondary school with a grade of 7 or higher, or his /her language skills are otherwise lacking, he/she must achieve the required proficiency level BEFORE taking this compulsory Swedish course unit. Information about brushing up on one's language skills can be found in Finnish here.

ECTS Credits: 2 ECTS credits Language of instruction: Swedish Timing: autumn or spring term

Learning outcomes:

Upon completion of the course the student should be able to read and understand texts from his/her academic field and make conclusions based on them. The student should be able to write typical professional emails and short reports. He/she should be able to carry himself/herself according to Swedish etiquette when acting as host or guest. The student should also be able to discuss current events and special field-specific matters, use the vocabulary of education and plan and give short oral presentations relating to his/her own field.

Contents:

Communicative oral and written exercises, which aim to develop the student's Swedish proficiency in areas relevant to his/her academic field and future professional tasks. The student practises oral presentation and pronunciation. Situational oral exercises done individually and in pairs and groups. Discussions in small groups. Current texts about the student's special field. Listening comprehension exercises. Written exercises relating to the student's professional field.

The students will receive coyrse material subject to a charge.

Assessment methods and criteria:

The course unit focuses on improving both oral and written language skills and requires active attendance and participation in exercises, which also require preparation time. 100% attendance is required. The course unit tests both oral and written language skills. Students participate in the teaching in either autumn semester or spring semester.

Grading:

Oral and written language proficiencies are tested separately and assessed using the so called KORU-criteria (publication of HAMK University of Applied Sciences, 2006). Separate grades will be awarded for the successful completions of both oral and written portions of the course unit: the possible passing grades are satisfactory skills and good skills (see language decree 481/03). The grades are based on continuous assessment and testing.
